"What drew me into nephrology and urology?

When I was a senior veterinary student at Cornell, Drs. Finco and Lorenz, faculty members at Georgia, were our student invited speakers. I was very impressed and determined to get to Georgia to study with them. Dr. Carl Osborne came to Auburn during my internship to tour the hospital in 1975 and I was fortunate to be able to speak with him briefly. He noted that I was in a great place since we had so many heartworm cases and no one knew about the effects of heartworm infection on the kidney. After he left, I decided to make this my thesis topic. With the help of Dr. Joe Spano, clinical pathologist, I focused on proteinuria in heartworm positive dogs. When I went to Georgia to finish my residency, I needed one more graduate course to complete my master's degree from Auburn. Fortunately, Dr. Finco was offering a graduate course in renal physiology that summer and he was also willing to read and critique my thesis.
